DESCRIPTION: Students will approach complex grammar structures and syntax through research and analysis of traits of famous historical figures and events that have influenced Italian history, art, politics, culture and society. Throughout the course students will improve their language skills and, with each discussion topic, deepen their understanding of contemporary Italy.

The course's preliminary period includes a general review of grammatical rules and activities designed to help discover of the city of Bologna, its history and culture, with a special focus on student life: the university and preparation for oral and written exams.

ACTIVITIES: The activities performed during the course include: reading/analyzing/summarizing of articles and biographies, grammar exercises, conversation, oral presentations, writing assignments. Homework, including composition writing and project preparation, is regularly assigned. All written work must be corrected and revised.

INSTRUCTORS: Guendalina Bamboli has taught at various language centers in Bologna. She is particularly interested in foreign student integration in the Italian school system. Clara Piovaccari teaches Italian as a foreign language at the language center of the University of Bologna, Bolzano and Ferrara. Prof. Piovaccari couples her teaching activity with the role of Chief of the Italian Language Certification panel.

CONTENT: Discovering Italian culture: our territory as seen through the lens of literature, history, cinema and the arts. Also, current events in the Italian contemporary society will be taken into consideration.
